What is a P&C?

- ✓ The Parents & Citizens' Association (P&C) is made up entirely of volunteers.
- ✓ P&C volunteers are dedicated parents and community members who want to contribute to the management and improvement of the school.
- ✓ The P&C is managed by an Executive comprising President, Vice President, Treasurer and Secretary.
- ✓ The Executive is elected at the AGM. Non-executive members can join at any time.

What is the purpose of our P&C?

Everything the P&C does aims to:

- ✓ build a strong sense of community spirit;
- ✓ contribute to the wellbeing of students; and
- ✓ achieve the best outcomes for our students.

What does our P&C do?

- ✓ Collaborates with the Principal and staff on a range of school policy decisions and the needs of students.
- ✓ Operates tuckshop and uniform shop
- ✓ Plans events and fundraising
- ✓ Assists with school functions
- ✓ Applies for grants
- ✓ Provides financial support to enhance facilities and resources for our students

How Can You Help or Become Involved?

- 1. Join the P&C by completing a membership form. P&C membership is free and you can choose to attend the monthly meetings. Even if you are not able to attending meetings, being a P&C member is a great way to learn what is happening at the school and have your say.
